# Instructions for Authors – Reviews

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# **Submission process**

All manuscripts must be submitted online at: http://mc.manu-scriptcentral.com/gebfra.

By submitting a manuscript the authors confirm that the manuscript has not been published previously and that it is not currently under consideration by any other journal. In the course of the submission and production process the authors will be asked to declare possible "conflicts of interest" (COI), confirm that the manuscript has been prepared in accordance with *Good Clinical Practice* and the *Declaration of Helsinki*, and that the tenets of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* have been followed. It is important that all mentioned co-authors agree to the publication.

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Articles submitted in German and accepted for publication will be translated into English by the Thieme publishing group (title, abstract and main text); the German version of those articles will be published online only.

Manuscripts submitted in English and accepted for publication will be published with a German translation of the title and abstract; all original articles are published both with an English and German abstract.

# Preparing the manuscript

Please read the following instructions carefully. Manuscripts that do not comply with the format detailed below will be rejected by the editorial office prior to peer review.

Language: Geburtshilfe und Frauenheilkunde accepts manuscripts written in English or German. Spelling should be US English or British English, but not a mixture. Also, articles with poor or insufficient language (German or English) will not be admitted to peer review.

NB: The review should be written in a way that is comprehensible to readers who are not specialists in the respective scientific field.

- Quality: Manuscripts with poor results, low scientific value or providing no new aspects to the scientific community will not be considered for publication.
- Length, abbreviations: There is no explicit limit on the length of articles submitted, but authors are reminded to be concise. If abbreviations are used in the text they should be defined in the text at first use.

# Arrangement

Manuscripts must be presented in the following order: title page, abstract, key words, introduction, review, conclusions, conflict of interest, acknowledgements, references, figure legends, tables and figures.

# Title page

The title page should include the title of the article, the full names of all authors, and addresses of all affiliations. The corresponding author should be clearly indicated.

# Abstract

A short, unstructured single-paragraph summary of the major points of the article suffices. The abstract of the manuscript should not exceed 250 words. The abstract must not contain abbreviations or references.

# Key words

Give three to five key words. Choose your key words from the list provided by the online submission system or add key words of your own.

# Introduction

The Introduction summarize the rationale for the review and what it aimed to add to the particular scientific field.

# **Review**

The Review section itself should contain the main body of the manuscript and outline and discuss background literature where necessary. The Review section should be broken into sections with short, informative headings.

# Conclusions

The authors should state clearly the main conclusions of the review and give a clear explanation of their importance and relevance. Summary illustrations may be included.

# **Conflict of Interest**

A conflict of interest exists when your interpretation of data or presentation of information may be influenced by your personal or financial relationship with other people or organizations. Authors must disclose any financial conflicts of interest. All conflicts of interest that are declared will be listed at the end of published articles. Where an author states no conflict of interest, the listing will read "The author(s) declare that they have no competing interests".

#### **Acknowledgements**

Please acknowledge anyone who contributed to the article by making substantial contributions to conception, design, acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data, or who was involved in drafting the manuscript or revising it critically, but who does not meet the criteria for authorship. Please also include the source(s) of funding for each author, and for the manuscript preparation.

#### References

References are listed at the end of the text in the order in which they appear in the text using Arabic numerals [in square brackets]. All references listed must be cited in the text. If cited in tables or figure legends, continue numbering according to the first identification of the table or figure in the text.

If automatic numbering systems are used, the reference numbers must be finalized and the bibliography must be fully formatted before submission.

Abbreviate journal names according to Index Medicus (PubMed). Authors are responsible for the accuracy of the references.

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Figures and photographs should be numbered and cited in the order they appear in the text. In general, full length articles will contain up to 6 figures and/or tables. Each figure should be submitted in a separate file. Figures including multiple parts (e.g. Fig. 1a, 1b, 1c) should be saved in a single file (e.g. Fig. 1a - c). The figure number should be placed above each figure.

The figure legends should be included in the main manuscript text file at the end of the document. For each figure, the following

information should be provided: Figure number (i.e. Fig. 1, 2, 3 etc); short title of figure (maximum 15 words); detailed legend (up to 1000 characters).

Figures must be provided in sufficient quality. Illustrations should be provided as separate files, not embedded in the text file. Suitable formats for figures are "tif", "gif", "jpg" and "bmp" files (resolution 300 dpi). Graphics will also be accepted in Word and PowerPoint graphic formats. All figures, tables and graphs should be numbered consecutively and be accompanied by a caption. There is no charge for the use of colour figures. – **Important:** If you intend to use figures or tables that have already been published, please contact the publisher directly to arrange the next steps. *Geburtshilfe und Frauenheilkunde* will not publish any material of which Thieme publishing group has not received unrestricted permission of use.

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
